Class 1A & 2A

In each class:

Regionals (32) week of February 19-23 (Monday-Friday)

Sectionals (8) on Tuesday-Wednesday & Friday, February 27, 28 and March 2

Super-Sectionals (4) on Tuesday, March 6

State Final on Friday-Saturday, March 9-10 at Carver Arena, Peoria Civic Center, Peoria, Illinois

Class 3A & 4A

In each class:

Sectional Complex: Regional Quarterfinal games, Monday, February 26

Regional Semifinal: Tuesday-Wednesday February 27 - 28

Regional (32) championship games, Friday, March 2

Sectionals (8) on Tuesday-Wednesday & Friday, March 6-7 and March 9

Super-Sectionals (4) on Tuesday, March 13

State Final on Friday-Saturday, March 16-17 at Carver Arena, Peoria Civic Center, Peoria, Illinois

Advancement:

Team winning each regional advances to correlated four-team sectional. Team winning sectional advances to correlated super-sectional. Team winning each super-sectional game advances to semifinal round of State Final Tournament.

How Pairings are Determined

Seeding shall occur only at the lowest level of grouping, and therefore, neither the super-sectionals nor the state final shall be seeded.

In Class 1A and 2A, all state series shall begin with sub-sectionals. A sub-sectional is a grouping of two geographic regionals.

In Class 3A and 4A, all state series shall begin with sectional complexes. In sectional groupings where excessive travel is a factor, geographic sub-sectionals may be used at the discretion of the IHSA Administrator.

In grouping and seeding a sectional complex, true seeds shall be used to populate the brackets except in cases where a conflict arises with pre-determined regional hosts. (For example, if the #1 and #8 seeds are both regional hosts, they cannot be assigned to the same regional and an adjustment must be made.)

In grouping and seeding a sub-sectional, only the top four seeds shall be separated. Seeds #1 and #4 shall be assigned to the same regional unless there is a hosting conflict, in which case seeds #1 and #3 shall be assigned to the same regional. The remaining schools shall be assigned to the regionals based on geographic proximity and paired according to their seeds.

In pairing the sectional semi-final round containing sub-sectionals, the regional from sub-sectional A containing the #1 seed shall be paired with the regional of sub-sectional B containing the #2 seed, and vice versa, except for the southernmost sectional in Class 4A, where the two regionals in each sub-sectional shall be paired with each other.

In pairing the sectional complexes, the sectional tournament shall be set up so that the semi-finals will pair the winners of the regionals with the numbers 1 & 4 seeds in one game, and the winners of the regionals with the numbers 2 & 3 seeds in the other game.

In all classes of bracketed team sports, the Executive Director is authorized to modify the state series brackets to accommodate unique travel situations.

Super-Sectionals: Correlated sectionals are assigned to send winner to pre-selected super-sectional site on basis of geography.

State Final: By blind draw in IHSA Office.

State Final Tickets

Regional: \$5.00 per person

*At venues hosting two Super-Sectional games on the same evening, the ticket price shall be \$10.00

State Finals: All tickets for the Class 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A Boys Basketball State Final Tournaments at Carver Arena, Peoria Civic Center will be priced at \$11.00. Season ticket packages will be made available for advance purchase first to IHSA member schools and then to the general public.
