DIRECTIONS & RULES

You are a staff reporter for Abraham High School's radio station WMIL (Middleland, III.). The station's News Director assigned you to attend a press conference hosted by Special Olympics Illinois (SOIL) in the Heartland Community College.

Michelle Mayer, the Senior Director of Marketing & Communications for SOIL will speak first to provide some background on SOIL. She will then provide an introduction to SOIL athlete, Daniel Johnson. Johnson is a native of Normal, Illinois, who won a silver medal in 400-meter snowshoeing (1:40.56) at the Special Olympics World Winter Games held in Turin, Italy, in March, 2025.

Johnson will speak about his experience to the group. He and Mayer will be available for one-on-one interviews following the formal part of their presentation.

Using your own recording equipment, the interview, any of the additional materials provided by SOIL, and the background information, create a 75-second MP3 news broadcast clip with a minimum of two sound bites (including at least one from today Heartland). Each story must end with: "Reporting for WMIL, this is (your name)."

Available equipment may include, but is not limited to: MP3 players, laptops, IPad, cell phones, and any other audio recorder.
