# By-Law Breakdown – Section 5.000: Season and Contest Limitations

Winter sports and activities are quickly approaching. As you and your coaches prepare for the upcoming seasons, review the season limitations for each sport and activity. This includes the starting and ending dates for the season, dates of first contests, and the contest limitations.

Coaches may not provide instruction in the skills of the sport, hold practices, or have their teams compete in contests before the established dates for each sport. Activities, such as scholastic bowl and chess, may organize their teams at any time. While most activities do not have a contest limitation, scholastic bowl does have a limit of 27 dates.

A date is defined as a single day on the calendar, which means participating in a meet or tournament held over two days counts as two dates. However, a conference meet or conference tournament is counted as one date. Contest limitations are exclusive of the IHSA State Series.

Note that contest limitations may be counted by dates in some sports and by the number of games/matches in others.



Sport & Activity Tracker (T): This page tracks the progress of required tasks in all sports and activities that your school has entered into the IHSA State Series. It contains the Entry Form to enter your programs into the IHSA State Series. Note that the entry deadline for the upcoming winter sports and activities (excluding chess) is November 1. Please confirm with your coaches and sponsors which teams and groups want to participate in the IHSA State Series and complete the entry form accordingly. The tracker also contains a form to register active Emerging sports & activities at your school.

School Information & Facility Maps (I): Each school's information is listed on this page, and schools can update phone numbers, website addresses, and social media handles. Schools may also list an Official Student Representative to receive communications from the IHSA Student Advisory Committee.

Voting & Town Meetings (V): This page permits administrators to nominate individuals for the IHSA Board of Directors and Legislative Commission. The Board & Commission ballot and By-law amendment ballot will be opened for voting during the designated voting periods. The schedule and locations of the annual Town Meetings & Principals' Rules Meetings are also listed here.
